Result of examination:

Due to extensive differences in soil color, texture and composition, the soil represented by specimens Q19 and Q20 as well as soil removed from specimens Q22 through Q24 and Q27 through Q32, did not originate from the areas represented by specimens K1 through K3 and K5 through K8. In addition, volcanic material present in the soil associated with the "victims" is consistent with having originated in the area around Guadalajara, Jalisco, Mexico. This soil is suitable for limited comparisons should a suspected burial site be located.

No soil suitable for significant mineralogical comparisons was found associated with specimen Q10.

No hairs dissimilar to the hairs of ENRIQUE CAMARENA were found on or in specimens Q15, Q23 and Q24.

No hairs dissimilar to the hairs of the unidentified person (body #2) were found on or in specimens Q25, Q27 and Q30.

Specimens Q13 and Q14 consist of horse hairs.

No hairs of value for significant comparison purposes were found on or in specimens Q10 through Q12, Q17, Q18, Q21, Q22, Q26, Q28, Q29, Q31 and Q32.

Light beige trilobal nylon fibers were found on specimens Q28 and Q29. These fibers are consistent with the type of fibers normally found in carpets.

The remaining foreign textile fibers in this case have been preserved for possible future comparison.

Specimen Q10 consists of a pair of red childrens shorts. Portions of the rear of specimen Q10 are missing; however, the edges of these missing portions are not suitable for significant comparison purposes. The manufacturer of this item could not be determined.

Specimen Q16 consists of a red acrylic fiber; however, the source of this fiber could not be determined.

Specimen K11 consists of a white braided cotton rope. Specimen Q18 consists of white cotton string. The ends of specimens K11 and Q18 are not suitable for significant comparison purposes. These items possess no unusual characteristics and the manufacturer of these items could not be determined.

Specimen Q21 consists of a piece of fabric tape. The edges of this tape are suitable for significant comparison purposes. The manufacturer of this tape could not be determined.

No invisible laundry markings or other identifying features were detected on any of the submitted items.

No plant material of value for significant comparison purposes were found on any of the submitted items.

Known samples of specimens Q22, Q23 and Q27 through Q32 have been mounted on glass microscope slides for possible future comparison.

Specimen Q12 is a cigarette butt which comes from a Marlboro (soft pack) cigarette. Specimen Q11 is too limited to allow for the specific brand to be determined.

Chemical tests for substances characteristically present in saliva were positive on specimen Q11. Grouping tests conducted on specimen Q11 disclosed the presence of the "B" blood group substance. No stains characteristic of saliva were found on specimen Q12.

No blood was found on specimen Q10.

An overhand knot and a knot consisting of a series of overhand knots were observed on K11. These knots are extremely common and did not require any special skill or training to tie.

The specimens are being retained in the FBI Laboratory until called for by a member of the Drug Enforcement Administration.

The results of the latent fingerprint examinations will be the subject of a separate report.

Result of examinations:

Dark brown head hairs were found on or in specimens Q38 and Q45. These hairs were compared to the head hair sample of ENRIQUE CAMARENA which was submitted earlier. These hairs exhibit the same microscopic characteristics as the head hairs of ENRIQUE CAMARENA, and accordingly, could have come from CAMARENA.

It is pointed out that hairs are not sufficiently unique to be positively associated with one individual to the absolute exclusion of all others.

No hairs like the hairs of CAMARENA were found on or in specimens Q35 through Q37, Q44, Q46, Q47 and Q49 through Q51.

The above-mentioned hairs were also compared to the head hairs of ALFREDO IAYALA which were also submitted earlier. No hairs like the hairs of IAYALA were found on any of the submitted items from the 1963 Mercury.

Blond to dark brown head hairs were found on or in specimens Q35, Q37, Q38, Q44 through Q47, Q49C and Q50A. These hairs are dissimilar to the head hairs of CANARENA and XAVALA and could not be associated with these sources. These hairs have been mounted on glass microscope slides for possible future comparison.

The fibers from the items from the 1963 Mercury which were submitted in this case were compared to the fibers removed from the items of clothing of CANARENA and XAVALA which were submitted earlier; however, no transfer of fibers was detected.

The soil associated with specimens Q19, Q20, Q22 through Q24 and Q27 through Q32 (further described in FBI Laboratory report 50314089 S VN RQ VI VQ dated March 25, 1965) did not originate from the sources of soil represented by specimens K17 through K22.

It should be noted that the type and physical configurations of the volcanic glass present in specimens K21 and K22 as well as the presence of charred plant material is similar to like portions of the aforementioned "Q specimens." This may indicate the region or area responsible as the depositional source for the "Q specimens." The specific significance of this is not known inasmuch as volcanic deposition can cover large areas with random deposition patterns. It is pointed out, however, that the soil represented by specimens K17 through K20 were either lacking in the described components or contained additional essential minerals which eliminate them as possible sources.

The soil represented by specimens Q33 and Q34 is the result of different sources being mixed together. In view of this, specimens Q33 and Q34 cannot be meaningfully compared with a known source.

The result of the serology examinations, the fingerprint comparisons and the disposition of all specimens will be the subject of a separate report.

Result of examination:

This report supplements and completes the requested examinations relative to the specimens listed in FBI Laboratory report 50403023 S VM RQ VI dated April 11, 1985. For a complete listing of items, please refer to that report.

Grouping tests conducted on the human blood identified on specimen Q37 were inconclusive. No blood was found on specimens Q36, Q38, Q50 and Q51.

Chemical tests for substances characteristically present in saliva were positive on cigarette butts from specimens Q39, Q40 and Q49B. Grouping tests conducted on the cigarette butts from specimens Q39 and Q40 were inconclusive. Grouping tests conducted on the cigarette butt from specimen Q49B disclosed the presence of the "A" and "H" blood group substances. Chemical tests for substances characteristic of saliva were negative on the cigarette butt from specimen Q49A.

All submitted specimens are being retained in the FBI Laboratory for future comparison purposes.

Result of examination:

Brown to dark brown head hairs were found in specimens Q52A, Q52B, Q83 and Q85. These hairs exhibit the same microscopic characteristics as the head hairs of ENRIQUE CAMARENA. Accordingly, these hairs could have originated from ENRIQUE CAMARENA.

It is pointed out that hair comparisons do not constitute a basis for absolute personal identification.

No hairs like the hairs of CAMARENA were found on or in specimens Q52C, Q53 through Q55A, Q56 through Q67, Q69 through Q82, Q84, Q86, Q87 and Q91 through Q94.

No hairs like the hairs of ZAVALA were found on or in any of the submitted items.

As previously reported in the FBI Laboratory report dated March 25, 1985 (50314080 S VM RQ VI VQ), light beige trilobal nylon fibers were found on specimens Q28 and Q29 (fabric from clothing of ZAVALA). These fibers exhibit the same microscopic and optical properties as the fibers composing the specimens K23B and K23E carpet samples, and accordingly, could have originated from the same sources as specimens K23B and/or K23E. It is noted that slight differences in the color were detected instrumentally. However, these slight differences could be attributed to the minute amount of color displayed by these fibers and/or other factors such as weathering and decomposition which may have occurred.

No fibers like the fibers composing specimens K23C, K23D, K23F, K23G, K24 through K26, K39, K41 through K43, K45 through K49 and Q71 were found on or in the submitted items.

It was determined that the nylon-based synthetic fibers comprising specimens K23B and K23E (50515068 S VM RQ UQ VI TN) match each other in texture, type and chemical composition.

Additionally, the nylon-based synthetic fibers comprising specimens Q28 and Q29 (50314080 S VM RQ VI TN) match each other, as well as specimens K23B and K23E, in texture, type and chemical composition.

Human blood, too limited in quantity for conclusive grouping purposes, was identified on the tissue contained in specimen Q73. No blood was found on specimens Q88 through Q90.

Specimens Q55B and Q68 were screened for the presence of controlled drug substances. Only Lidocaine was identified in specimen Q55B. Additionally, chemical moieties associated with the B vitamins were identified in Q55B and a chemical derivative of the amino acid glycine was identified in specimen Q68.

Soil represented by specimens Q19 and Q20, the soil removed from specimens Q22 through Q24 and Q27 through Q32 (50314080 S VM RQ VI UQ) ^{was} compared to K27 through K29, K33 through K37, K38 and K44 for similarities in essential mineral composition and color.

Similarities were noted in the mineral composition between the "Q specimens" and specimen K29. In view of this, the "area" represented by specimen K29 cannot be ruled out as a possible source area.

The aforementioned "Q specimens" could not be associated with any of the other "K" soil samples.

All submitted specimens are being retained in the FBI Laboratory for future comparison purposes.

The results of the latent fingerprint examinations will be the subject of a separate report.

Result of examination:

Soil samples removed from CAMARENA and ZAVALA (previousl described in FBI Laboratory report 50314080 S VM RQ VI VQ dated March 25, 1985) were compared to specimens K52 through K59, K61 through K79. Due to mineral composition and/or abundance variations, the soils from the victim's bodies could not be associated with specimens K52 through K57, K59, K61 through K59.

No meaningful mineralogical differences were noted between the "victim soils" and specimen K58. In view of this, the soil associated with the victims either originated from the individual source area represented by specimen K58 or from a source of soil that exhibits the same characteristics.

One dark brown head hair, which has been ~~forcibly~~ removed, was found in specimen Q106. This hair exhibits the same microscopic characteristics as the head hairs of ENRIQUE CAMARENA. Accordingly, this hair could have come from ENRIQUE CAMARENA.

It is pointed out that hair comparisons do not constitute a basis for absolute personal identification.

No hairs like the hairs of CAMARENA or ALFREDO ZAVALA were found on or in specimens Q95 through Q105 and Q107 through Q119.

The hairs found in specimens Q95 through Q119 and from the items submitted previously were compared to the head hairs of FRANCISCO TEJEDA, specimen K51. No hairs like the hairs of TEJEDA were found on or in any of these items.

Specimens Q96, Q97, Q102, Q103 and K60 were compared to the ropes and cordages submitted previously in this case. These items are dissimilar to the previously submitted ropes and cordages and could not be associated with those items.

Two dark reddish-brown hairs were found in specimen K61. These hairs are dissimilar to the head hairs of CAMARENA, ZAVALA and TEJEDA and could not be associated with them.

Soil samples removed from CAMARENA and ZAVALA (previously described in FBI Laboratory report 50314080 S VM RQ VI VQ dated March 25, 1985) were compared to specimens K80 through K85. Due to mineral composition and/or significant abundance variations, the soils on the victims' bodies could not be associated with specimens K80, K83 and K85.

Slight compositional differences between the soil on the victims' bodies and specimens K82 and K84 were noted. These differences are not sufficient to totally eliminate these known samples as possible "source soils."

No meaningful mineralogical differences were noted between the soil on the victims' bodies and specimen K81. In view of this, it is logical to consider the soil represented by specimen K81 as a possible source for the soil on the victims.

Numerous brown to dark brown head hairs were found on or in specimens Q143 and Q144. Some of these hairs are dissimilar to the head hairs of ENRIQUE CAMARENA and ALFREDO ZAVALA and could not be associated with these sources. The remainder of the hairs are not suitable for significant comparison purposes due to their deteriorated condition.

Olive-drab woolen fibers, were also found in specimen Q144. These fibers have been mounted on a glass microscope slide for possible future comparison.

Specimen Q144 was examined by Dr. Douglas H. Ubelaker, Curator, and Ms. Stephanie H. Damadio, Museum Specialist, Department of Anthropology, Smithsonian Institution, Washington, D. C.

The findings of Dr. Ubelaker and Ms. Damadio are enclosed.

This hair exhibits the same individual microscopic characteristics as the head hairs of MARTINEZ-HERRERA, and accordingly, this hair could have originated from MARTINEZ-HERRERA.

HAIRS

Brown to dark brown head hairs, some of which have been forcibly removed, were found on or in specimens Q38 (Mercury-right rear floor mat), Q45 (Mercury-vacuum sweepings, right front seat), Q52A (Guest house vacuum sweepings), Q52B (Guest house vacuum sweepings), Q83 (V.W. vacuum sweepings, front floor), Q85 (V.W. vacuum sweepings, rear floor) and Q106 (vacuum sweepings, bedroom #4). These hairs exhibit the same individual microscopic characteristics as the head hairs of ENRIQUE CAMARENA, and accordingly, could have originated from ENRIQUE CAMARENA.

One dark brown head hair was found in specimen Q52B (Guest house vacuum sweepings). This hair exhibits the same individual microscopic characteristics as the head hairs of RENE VERDUGO, and accordingly, could have originated from RENE VERDUGO.

One dark brown head hair was found in specimen Q52C (Guest house vacuum sweepings). This hair exhibits the same individual microscopic characteristics as the head hairs of SERGIO ESPINO-VERDIN, and accordingly, could have originated from ESPINO-VERDIN.

FIBERS

Light beige trilobal nylon fibers were found on specimens Q28 and Q29 (fabric from clothing of ALFREDO ZAVALA). These fibers exhibit the same microscopic and optical properties as the fibers composing specimen K23B (Guest house carpet) and specimen K23E (living/dining room). Accordingly, these fibers could have originated from specimens K23B and/or K23E.

Off-white trilobal polyester fibers were found on or in specimens Q146A (debris from CAMARENA burial sheet) and

Q160 (cord and CAMARENA cloth tape). These fibers exhibit the same microscopic and optical properties as the fibers composing specimens K23D (hallway), K24 (bedroom #4), K25 (den) and/or specimens K23C (bedroom #1) and K23F (bedroom #2). Accordingly, these fibers could have originated from the same sources as specimens K23D, K24, K25 and/or specimens K23C and K23F.

Two rose colored trilobal polyester fibers were found in the debris from Q160. These fibers exhibit the same microscopic and optical properties as the fibers composing specimen K23G (bedroom #3). Accordingly, these fibers could have originated from the same source as specimen K23G.

FABRIC

Specimen Q23 (fabric from CAMARENA burial sheet), Q58 (pillowcase from top floor bedroom), Q146 (fabric from CAMARENA burial sheet) and specimen Q147 (portion of a pillowcase from bedroom #3) consist of pieces of printed light blue polyester/cotton fabric. These pieces of fabric are alike in all observable characteristics. Accordingly, all of these items could have originated from a common manufacturer.

CORDAGE

Specimen K11 (CAMARENA binding rope), specimen Q148 (portion of a rope from CAMARENA's body) and specimen Q149 (portion of a rope from covered patio) consist of pieces of white braided cotton and polyester rope. These pieces of rope are alike in all observable characteristics. Accordingly, all of these pieces of rope are consistent with having originated from the same source.

TAPE

Specimen Q21 (portion of CAMARENA tape blindfold) and Q160 (CAMARENA cloth tape) consist of pieces of 1 15/16" white cotton adhesive tape. These pieces of tape are alike in adhesive and in all observable characteristics. Accordingly, these pieces of tape are consistent with having originated from the same source.

Present in specimen Q160 are limited and somewhat contaminated samples of adhesive material adhering to one side of a fiber-backed tape.

This adhesive material matches dried samples of adhesive present on one side of some of the Q21 fiber-backed tapes in color, texture and type. Therefore, the adhesive substances present in Q21 and Q160 either originated from exactly the same source of tape or from separate sources which exhibit the same physical characteristics and chemical composition as the adhesive materials in Q21 and Q160.

BLOOD

Grouping tests conducted on the human blood identified on specimen Q37 (Mercury-left rear floor mat) were inconclusive. Human blood, too limited in quantity for conclusive grouping purposes, was identified on the tissue contained in specimen Q73 (metal bar and miscellaneous items from trunk of V.W.).

SOIL

Due to extensive differences in soil color, texture and composition, the soil represented by specimens Q19 (soil from CAMARENA's right knee) and Q20 (soil from CAMARENA's shorts) as well as soil removed from specimens Q22 through Q24 (burial sheet) and Q27 through Q32 (ZAVALA's clothing), did not originate from the areas represented by specimens K1 through K3 (soil from area where bodies located) and K5 through K8 (Rancho LaAngostura).

No meaningful mineralogical differences were noted between the "victim soils" and specimen K58 (soil from south of pit in LaPrimavera). In view of this, the soil associated with the victims either originated from the individual source area represented by specimen K58 or from a source of soil that exhibits the same characteristics.

No meaningful mineralogical differences were noted between the soil on the victim's bodies and specimen K81 (soil from suspected site - two feet down). In view of this, it is logical to consider the soil represented by specimen K81 as a possible source for the soil on the victims.

It was determined that the polyester resin-based carpet fibers comprising specimens K23C, K23D and K23F (50515068 S VM RQ UQ VI) match the beige-colored fibers from Q146A (51202016 S RQ) and Q160 (60519038 S RQ) in chemical composition.

It was determined that the polyester resin-based carpet fibers comprising specimens K24 and K25 (50515068 S-VM RQ UQ VI) match each other in chemical composition. However, slight instrumental differences were detected when comparing K24 and K25 with the above-described specimens.

Additionally, the polyester resin-based carpet fibers comprising specimen K23G (50515068 S VM RQ UQ VI) match the rose-colored fiber from Q160 (60519038 S RQ) in chemical composition.
